Panel to Discuss the Economic Crisis & its Impact on the Nonprofit Sector

Dallas - On Wednesday, November 19th, nonprofits throughout North Texas will come together at ***Continuing The Good Amid An Economic Crisis*** to address the current economy and how it might impact nonprofit organizations and philanthropic giving.
